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Welcome to Sociology-

Sociology is concerned with how specific people interact with one another in group situations, and how their behavior varies from one society to another. The purpose of this course is to introduce the scientific study of humans in society. Through the study of sociology, you develop a respect for various group, ethnic, and cultural differences. The class considers the consequences of social stereotyping and the value of basing beliefs about social groups upon verifiable evidence.

Participation: The dissemination, sharing, and meaningful discussion of any and all appropriate/relevant ideas is of paramount importance in this classroom. Student must be active learners. This requires each student to take notes, turn in classwork, and be an active participant in classroom discussions and activities, which requires each student to listen as well as talk and participate in class-centered activities.

- Assessments (projects, presentations, tests and quizzes, and written activities) will comprise 80% of the student's grade.
- Class Work/Homework is worth 20%.
- All activities help students prepare for unit assessments.
